Until the next revision of ER 1110-1-8153 is completed, revised text, underlined below, is provided for immediate use and reference:

General: In all cases change “M²S²” to “M2S2” in this reference and in all written correspondence.

Paragraph 6d and 6e are renumbered and changed to:

“d. M2S2 activities should not be confused with the decision making or management of the projects or programs which make use of munitions services. The component with responsibility for execution of the project or program makes decisions for actions under their project or program.

(1) M2S2 for FUDS will be completed in accordance with Engineer Regulation (ER) 200-3-1, Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS) Program Policy and the USACE Program Management Plan for Implementing the Army Environmental Cleanup Strategic Plan for FUDS.

(2) For non-FUDS projects, M2S2 will be completed in accordance with the specific program or customer requirements.

Paragraph 7b is changed to “The primary goal of USACE operating under the MMRP is to take those actions necessary to protect human health and the environment from the hazards associated with UXO, DMM, or MC through the implementation of effective, legally compliant, and cost-effective response actions. This goal reflects the statutory mandate of the DERP (Title 10 United States Code [USC] §2701) and the requirements of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) (42 USC §9601 et seq.) to protect human health, welfare, and the environment.”

Paragraph 8a is changed to read “USACE organizational elements execute M2S2 work in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, and policies.”

Paragraph 8c(6) is changed to “EP 200-1-18. Five-Year Reviews of Military Munitions Response Projects. This provides procedural guidance for implement Five year Reviews.”

Paragraph 9a is changed to “For FUDS projects, the determination of the laws and regulations governing environmental aspects for a specific MMRP project will be made in consultation with the appropriate Office of Counsel pursuant to the FUDS ER 200-3-1. In the event of any sort of dispute with a regulator over the governing laws on a FUDS project, the District providing general legal services will consult with the Headquarters Office of Counsel (CECC-E) and unless otherwise directed represent the agency in negotiations or adversary proceedings. The Office of Counsel at the EM CX is available for consultation and assistance.

Paragraph 14a is changed to “Divisions have overall responsibility for execution of M2S2 actions by their PM and Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) designated Districts, as appropriate. For FUDS, refer to ER 200-3-1 for military environmental restoration boundaries for each Division.”

Paragraph 17a deletes “Mobile (CESAM)”, and is changed to “There are nine (9) authorized Military Munitions RADs. These include: Baltimore (CENAB); Omaha (CENWO); Fort Worth (CESWF); Louisville (CELRL); Los Angeles (CESPL); Sacramento (CESPK); Savannah (CESAS); Honolulu (CEPOH); and the Huntsville Center (CEHNC).”

Glossary delete “CESAM Corps of Engineers – Mobile District”.
