CITATION

For an act of bravery in the rescue of six persons from drowning on 12 July 1982, at Lock and Dam No. 12, U.S. Army Engineer District, Northland. Upon learning that a pleasure boat had gone over the crest of the dam, he and a fellow employee proceeded by rowboat to the apron of the dam where, without regard for the great danger to their personal well-being, they entered the swift, waist-deep water and assisted two injured persons to safety on a nearby island. They then reentered the turbulent water, located four remaining survivors, and assisted them to the safety of the island. The conspicuous bravery he exhibited in this heroic act reflects great credit upon himself, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Department of the Army.
